Topic: A Synopsis of Sri Lankan Architec-ture: from the early days to the present

From the time of Kuveni and the kingdom of Vijaya, with the glimpses of Thambapani, the wattle and daub houses, the ancient architecture of Anuradhapura-Polonnaruwa pe-riod and its relationship to Buddhism. The Hindu influence and the Kandyan and Kotte kingdoms. The colonial influences - the blend of Portuguese, Dutch and British Architecture and the Moor or Mughal connections. Post Victorian, Dominion and Soviet Eastern bloc influence was followed by the modern movement in architecture in Sri Lanka led by the three greats Bawa, Minnette and Valentine. With foreign aid Chinese and other Asian buildings emerged leading into the current architectural practices and the green sustainable movement.

Includes a description of the profession of Architecture

in Sri Lanka – The beginnings, the formation in 1957 of the Ceylon institute of Architects, the connection with the RIBA, the incorporation of the Sri Lanka Institute of Ar-chitects (SLIA) in 1967 by an act of Parliament. This led to several amendments and today is considered the most pro-lific professional body related to the construction industry. Uniquely the registration board is also under the SLIA.

Architect: Jayantha Perera

is a Charted Architect who graduated from the University of Moratuwa. Currently the Vice Chairman of the Green Building Council of Sri Lanka and a Member of the World Green Building Council, working on sustainable architec-ture.
